

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
ArcGIS Pro - Module 1 - Getting Started

select “Zoom to Layer”




ArcGIS Pro - Module 2 - Making a Map




1 - in Windows, navigate to the location where you exported your map

2 - double-click on the file to view the image of the map




ArcGIS Pro - Module 3 - Manipulating data

to see Greenland and Canada




Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) Projection




WGS84 Geographic Projection




